Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Horizon family warmly welcomes all our students and parents to 2023! We are grateful and appreciative of our parents' support and look forward to your continued support and partnership to educate our students.

1. Introduction by Principal, Mrs Ong Hui Khim

First and foremost, I would like to thank the past Principal, Mrs Grace Leong, for her leadership and service to the school. I am honoured to be given this opportunity to join the Horizon family and build upon the good work of my predecessors who came before me. It is the hope of my staff and myself to cater to the diverse interests and needs of our students and realise our school's vision of Confident Individuals, Responsible Citizens.

The new academic year has begun and I sincerely thank you for your continuous support throughout the past years. It is really your partnership with the school and the teachers that learning continues to flourish in the school despite the challenging situations brought about by COVID-19.

Every child is different, with their own strengths, aptitudes, interests and personality. Your children will be poets, scientists, musicians, athletes, leaders, or any other profession which will contribute to the beauty of this world. Your children will also be friends, upstanders, philanthropists, helpers, motivators, comforters, or any other role that brings joy to others in any circumstance. 2. <u>Towards a Safe and Secure Horizon</u>

In the interest of student safety, the school will continue educating students about good road safety practices. We appeal to parents/guardians to reiterate the importance of road safety practices and be good role models of these practices to your children.

Parents are permitted to drop off and pick up their children at the school foyer. During dismissal, the vehicular entry gate will only be open when the school buses have departed the school. Do maintain the "Stop, Drop and Go" practice when alighting or picking up your child at the foyer. Do not park and wait at the foyer. This will inconvenience other parents. Should you need to park your car, car parks can be found at the neighbouring Multi-Storey Carparks at Edgedale Green and Punggol Spectra. Students can also use gates B and C as alternative points of access from Edgedale Green, Punggol Breeze and Punggol Spectra.



We would also like to remind parents to show consideration for other road users and to be respectful of LTA's road rules and regulations. Please do not,

- park 9 metres within a bus stop area ;
- park 6 metres within a junction ;
- park 3 metres within a fire-hydrant ;
- park 50 metres of a pedestrian crossing ;
- park abreast (double parking)
- park at entrances or exits of buildings.

For the safety and security of all, visitors to the school are required to enter the school at Gate A and sign in at the security post with a photo ID as proof of identity. Visitors will be issued with a pass, which they will have to wear at all times while in the school. Visitors' movements are restricted to the General Office and the ground level non-teaching areas, e.g. the book shop and dental clinic. Visitors to MK@Horizon and KCare@Horizon are to present their authorization pass to the security officer on duty as proof of identity before entry.

4. School Matters

The school is committed to nurturing our students into confident and responsible leaders. Together, in partnership, we will be able to provide the best possible learning experience for your children.

(i) Attendance

We strongly urge all parents/guardians to avoid travel during term time. Presence in school during term time ensures that your child/ward is not disadvantaged by missing out on curriculum content taught. In the event of his/her absence, a medical certificate from a doctor or letter from parents/guardians would need to be submitted promptly to the Form Teacher upon your child's / ward's return.

(ii) Punctuality

We emphasise the importance of being punctual when reporting to school and lessons. This practice is consistent with Habit 1: Being Proactive. All students are expected to be in their classrooms by 7.30 a.m. and will participate in the flag-raising ceremony at 7.35 a.m. In line with our School Value: Respect, let us all ensure that these respectful practices are adhered to.



(iii) Attire

We would like to instil a sense of pride and strong identity with Horizon Primary School, students are required to report to school in full uniform on all days unless there is P.E. Students in P1 and P2 do not need to be in their school uniform on the following days:

(i) Student Organiser

Every student will have a Student Organiser specially designed by the school. The theme for 2023 is "Connect. Collaborate. Create." The organiser is a useful and creative tool for students to learn how to manage their daily lives. Students have to bring their organisers daily to record important information from the teachers. Kindly advise your child to alert the teachers if you have written some notes for their teacher in the organiser.

(ii) Parent-School Communication App – Parents Gateway

Parents Gateway is a mobile app that provides a one-stop portal to keep parents informed about key administrative matters. The school will use Parents Gateway to provide timely announcements regarding school's events and activities. Parents will also be able to perform administrative functions using this mobile app, such as providing consent for their children to participate in school activities.

6. Online Learning Platforms at Horizon Primary School

At Horizon Primary School, ICT is used productively for quality learning in support of the curriculum. The following online platforms are accessible by your child / ward even when they are at home. More details will be communicated to P1 parents via Parents Gateway. For P2 to P6 students, their login details from the previous year are still valid.

Singapore Student Learning Space (SLS)

The SLS is an online platform with tools and curriculum-aligned resources for all students to learn anytime, anywhere, collaboratively and at their own pace. With the SLS, students can take greater ownership of their learning and pick up skills and habits that prepare them for lifelong learning.

Teachers will also use the SLS to complement classroom teaching and learning. Students will be assigned meaningful lessons to learn on their own and at their own pace. They will be able to learn collaboratively with their friends on SLS. SLS can be accessed from <u>https://learning.moe.edu.sg</u>.



KooBits

KooBits is an online learning platform for students learning Mathematics. It contains tutorials, topical Math questions and solutions with models and diagrams. Students are encouraged to be problem-solvers through the various activities and competitions available on KooBits. KooBits can be accessed from https://problemsums.koobits.com/.

Ezhishi

Ezhishi is a supplementary Chinese Language reading and learning resource for students learning Chinese Language. It consists of an online learning platform and bi-weekly magazines. It promotes self-directed learning and to arouse student's interest in learning Chinese Language. Ezhishi can be accessed from https://www.ezhishi.net.

Do note that students may access 2023 learning resources for SLS from the start of the year. For other learning platforms, they may access 2023 learning resources from 1 February 2023.

7. Student Matters

(i) DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) Time before Flag Raising Ceremony

To encourage our students to read widely, students are required to bring an <u>English Language</u> <u>book</u> on Mondays to Wednesdays and a <u>Mother Tongue Language book</u> on Thursdays and **Fridays**. The choice of books should be age-appropriate and vary across genres and content. Through this, we aim to develop a reading culture and a strong passion for reading in our students.

(ii) 2023 Class Timetable

Students will be issued their class timetables on Friday, 13 January 2023, and we encourage our students to pack their bags based on the subjects indicated in their timetables. This ensures that your child/ward will have the necessary books and materials for his/her daily lessons and activities. In addition, this practice also results in students' school bags being maintained at a manageable weight.

(iii) Quick Bites (QB)

Quick Bites provides students who have a long wait between their recess and lunch with the opportunity to have a snack in the interim. Between **12.15 p.m. – 12.45 p.m.**, students can have a healthy snack (e.g. a piece of fruit or a sandwich) which can be consumed in class within 10 minutes. However, P5 and P6 students taking Higher Mother Tongue and Foundation Science will not have QB on Mondays as they are scheduled for a lunch break before their lessons in the afternoon.

(iv) Co- Curricular Activity (CCA), Programme for Active Learning (PAL) and SwimSafer

CCAs provide our students with the platform to develop their interest and talents, along with the opportunity to forge friendships and build character. Feedback from the students have also shown that they enjoy the CCA sessions as they get to bond with their teachers, peers and coaches/instructors. We are glad that we have been able to resume physical CCA sessions in 2022 safely and will continue to do so in 2023. Students can look forward to showcasing their talents and strive for excellence through the various competition platforms such as National School Games, Singapore Youth Festival as well as performances in school and external venues. More details will be provided on the CCA sessions in a separate letter.

Programme for Active Learning (PAL) in Horizon will commence on Monday, 9 January 2023, for P1 students and Thursday, 12 January 2023, for P2 students. Through PAL, P1 & P2 students learn values and build character through experiential activities across the four domains of Sports & Games, Visual Arts, Performing Arts and Outdoor Education.



In alignment to our PE curriculum and equipping them with the necessary skills and knowledge in water safety, we will be having SwimSafer for our P5 and selected P6 students this year. For more details, kindly refer to the separate letters that have been sent out previously.

We would like to thank all parents and guardians for supporting your child's/ward's holistic development through our programmes.
