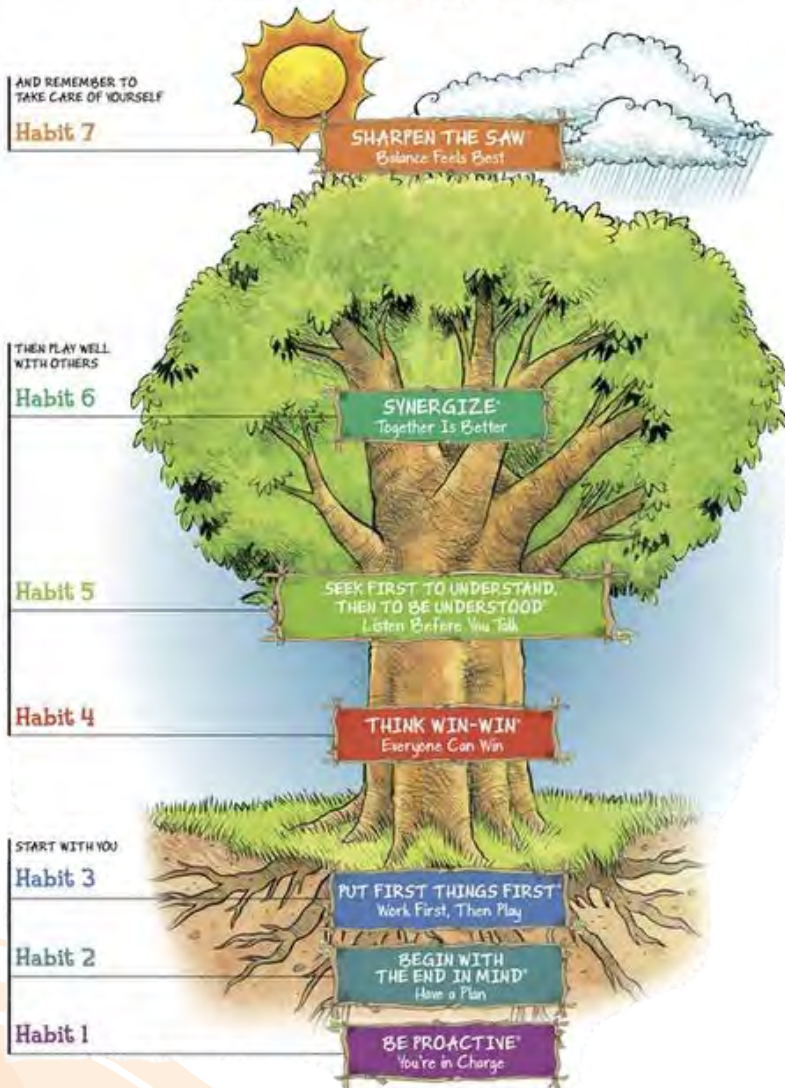

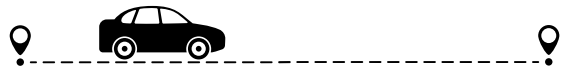

SCHOOL VISITATION

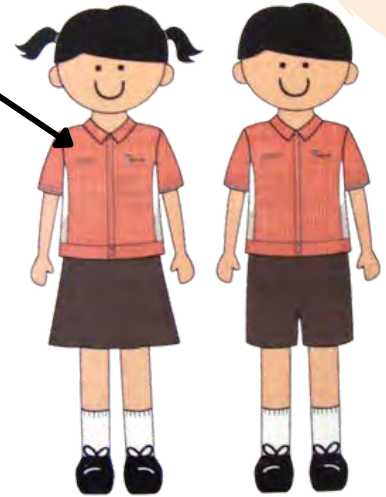
- Opening hours for General Office: Monday - Friday, 7 a.m. - 6 p.m.

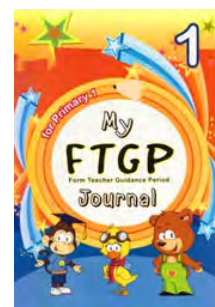

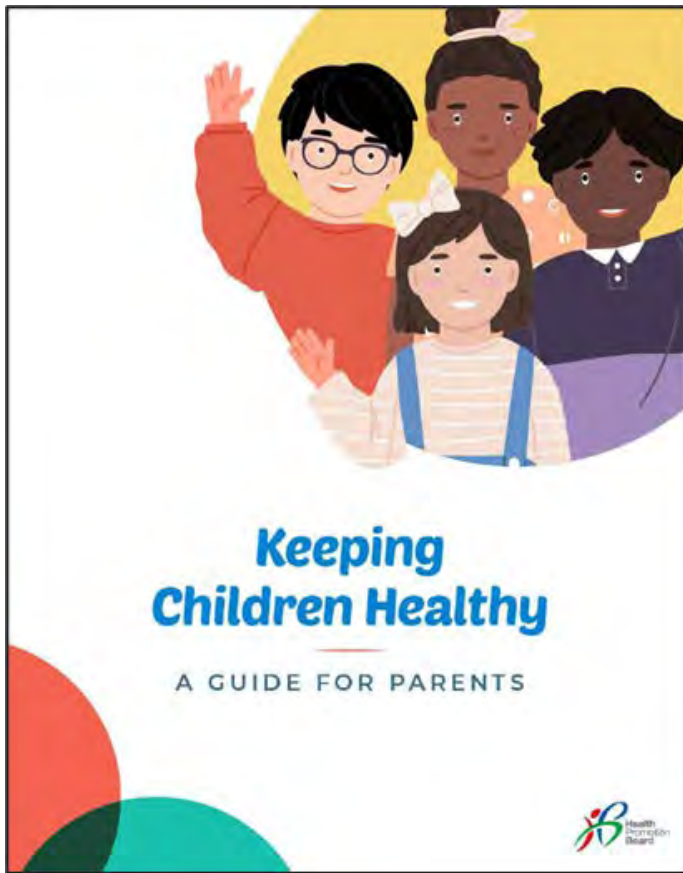

Keeping Children Healthy - A guide for parents



Is your child transitioning to P1?

Unlike preschool where your child is served meals based on a fixed menu, they will have to start making more independent choices about what they want to eat in primary school.



This transition from being served to choosing for themselves can be daunting for children. Prepare them for it in the following ways:

- a) Talk to your child about 'My Healthy Plate' and highlight the importance of different food groups in our diet. Teach them how to choose a combination of dishes using the 'quarter-quarter-half' method so they learn to incorporate all food groups in their meals.

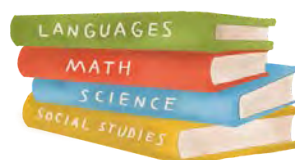
1) How to purchase school uniforms and books?

2) Will the Name Tag (for school uniform and PE attire) be provided on the first day of school?

All students must put on their name tags for identification purpose. From the first day of school, P1 students are to put on their temporary name tags (on the lanyard provided by school) till the name tags for school uniform and PE attire are ready.

Name tags for school uniform and PE attire will only be ready for collection from mid-January 2024 onwards.

RECESS ARRANGEMENT

1) What is the duration of the recess?

The duration of each recess is 30 minutes. The typical recess timing for P1 students is from 9.15 a.m. to 9.45 a.m. However, there will be adjustments made to their P1 recess timing during the first few days of school to ensure that they have sufficient time to transit and have a good canteen experience.

2) Will there be any buddy system during recess?

There will be a P4 buddy assigned to every P1 student to assist them during recess. There will also be teachers stationed in the canteen to help the P1 students.

3) Can parents accompany their child on the first few days of school during recess?

Parents will be allowed to accompany child/ward into the school premise on first day of school. The accompanying parents can see their child/ward having their recess on first day of school. From day 2 onwards, parents will not be allowed to enter the school premises as students from Primary 2 to 6 will be in school.





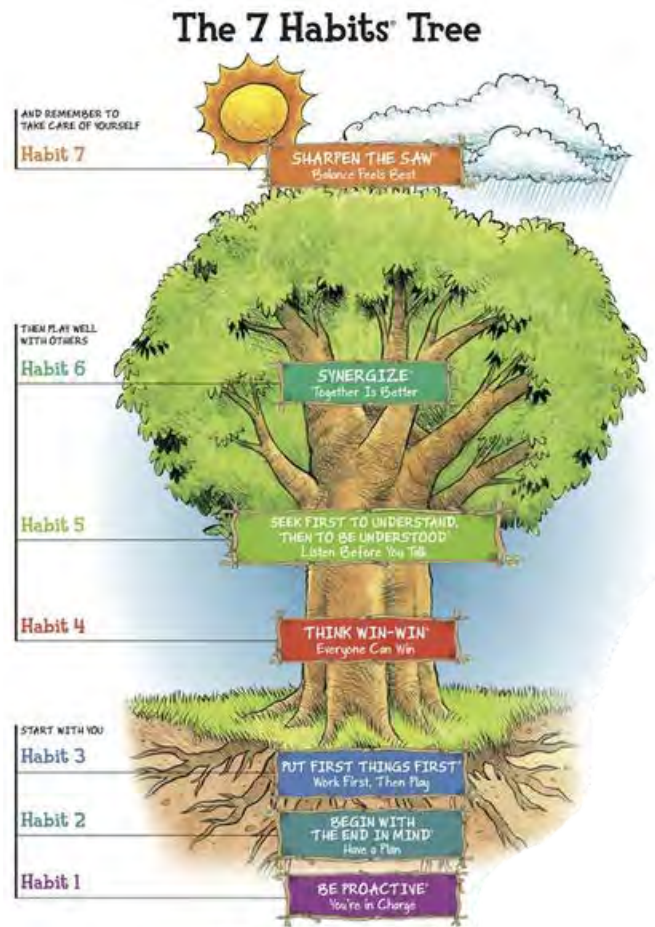
7 HABITS

1) Why has Horizon decided to adopt the 7 Habits theory by Stephen Covey as the basis of Horizon’s approach to moulding the students?

Aligned with the school’s vision and philosophy that every child is a leader, it is our school’s mission to nurture every child to lead their lives responsibly and to contribute with joy.

The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People is adopted as our tool to inculcate values and instill leadership skills in our students.

In addition to 7 Habits, the school has Values in Action (VIA) and a whole-school leadership development weaved into our Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) curriculum. Students are given opportunities to apply their leadership in various platforms.
