

 Get your child to take pictures of objects in the home environment he/she is interested in to learn new vocabulary words.

You may use an old camera or your smart phone as this will inculcate a sense of responsibility.

Letter/Word Swat!




Write the target letters/words on post-its.

Scatter them around the table, wall or on the floor.

Take turns with your child to read out a letter sound or word. Be the first to find and swat it!

Guide him/her to call an object that has the beginning letter sound. Assist your child to craft a sentence if you are working on the word.

If you do not have a fly swatter, you may get your child to jump and high-five or stamp with his /her feet on it.



Goal!

Crush the post-its (with the letters or words written on them) into balls. Each play gets a straw. Take turn to blow the balls into the 'goal posts' made out of empty tissue box with one side cut out.

Read the word to score the point!
